- 3. If any student fails to secure minimum passing marks (40%) by above formula, he/she may be awarded grace mark to secure minimum 40% passing marks. this shall be applicable for this semester only (AY 2020-21).
- 4. The 2nd and 3rd year students of Academic Year 2020-21 may be provisionally admitted in the 3rd and 4th year (AY 2021-22), respectively and their regular examination of 2nd & 3rd year (2nd Semester) will be conducted after normalization of COVID-19 Pandemic conditions.
- 5. The backlog examinations Final Year students of B.Sc. (Hons) Agriculture/Horticulture/Forestry 2nd Semester (AY 2020-21) and odd semester will be conducted in offline mode from last week of July 2021 to first week of August 2021.
- 6. The assignment under the student READY programme/ ELP/practical modules/other records of UG final year students may be evaluated on the basis of offline/online presentation mode.

M.Sc. / Ph.D. Programme:

- The PG/ Ph.D. student of previous year (Semester 1st) of session 2020-21 will be provisionally admitted in the next semester. However, the examination of 1st semester will be conducted after normalization of COVID-19 Pandemic conditions and result will be declared before 31st December 2021.
- In order to timely completion of degree programme, the respective faculty Chairman will ensure timely conduction of written and oral comprehensive/ preliminary examination/ thesis writing/ thesis submission/post thesis viva/final thesis submission of final year M.Sc. and Ph.D. Students.

Others:

- Constituent colleges of the University may open the hostel for UG final year students/ PG student during examination period following the strict protocols of COVID-19.
- Teachers/Staff engaged in examination must be vaccinated. Invigilators and students should strictly follow the COVID-19 protocol during the examination.
- If any student of UG/PG final year fails to appear at the final examination/oral presentation due to COVID-19 positive, he/she shall be provided another chance of examination on production of requisite certificate subject to payment of required fees.

Therefore, modifications made in syllabus/curriculum of different subjects by courses committees of respective Departments are presented here for further review and approval. Resolve to approve, the minutes of courses committee of different Departments with respect to modifications/ alterations/ substitution, as the case may be, is outlined herewith: 1. In the Department of Fruit science in Ph.D. programme, the minor

- and supporting courses viz., FORT-524 (Medicinal and Aromatic Plants), FORT-531 (Agroforestry Systems and Practices), FORT-532 (Watershed Management), FORT-536 (Remote Sensing and Geographic Information System), PHT-521 (Analytical Techniques for Fresh and Processed Horticultural Produce) and FLS-535 (Protected Floriculture) of other departments have been changed with suitable courses of same departments as they are not running now in respective departments. These replaced courses are FPU-526 (Biotechnological Approaches and Agrotechniques for MAP species), SAF-527 (Agroforestry Systems), NRM-512 (Land Use and Watershed Management), NRM-531 (Remote Sensing and Geographic Information System), PHT-532 (Analytical Techniques for Fresh and Processed Horticultural Produce) and FLS-532 (Protected Floriculture). The course content of replaced courses is annexed herewith. The committee approved lime color for the cover page of Ph.D. thesis.
- 2. In UG course of the Department of Vegetable Science, the substitution of term/ "Tropical and Sub- tropical Vegetable Crops" with "Summer Vegetable Crops" in course VEG-121 (Summer Vegetable Crops) and "Cool season Vegetable Crops" with "Winter Vegetable Crops" in VEG-211 (Winter Vegetable Crops) and "Exotic vegetables" with "Tuber and Spice Crops" in theory part of course VEG-322 (Seed Production of Vegetable, Tuber and Spice Crops) are proposed. Besides, the topic "Physiological disorder" in theory part of VEG-121 (Summer Vegetable Crops) is added and topic "Calculation of Rate of Air Exchange in an active Winter Cooling System" in practical of course VEG-212 (Precision Farming and Protected Cultivation) is deleted due to repetition. In PG courses, the vegetable "cluster bean" in Unit-II in VEG-511 (Production Technology of Warm Season Vegetable Crops), Mogri in Unit-II, Moringa in Unit-III and Kachri in Unit-V in course VEG-533 (Production Technology of Under-Exploited Vegetable Crops) are added. Further, the topic "Modern Nursery Concept" and "Role of PGRs" in theory of course VEG-521 (Production Technology of Cool Season Vegetable Crops) are added. Similarly, in VEG-523 (Breeding of Vegetable Crops) the topic "Pollination Technique and Basis of Heterosis" and vegetable "Cowpea" in Unit-III, Cucumber in Unit-IV and Onion and Garlic in Unit-VI in theory part are added.
- 3. In the Department of Floriculture & Landscape Architecture, the code of all the courses running at UG and PG level named as FLS be changed as FLA and revised course code and semester wise distribution.
- 4. In the Department of Post Harvest Technology, the topic "Smart Packaging" in theory part of PHT-311 and topic "Minimal Processing" in theory and practical part in course PHT-321 are

included. In PG Programme, the topic "holding" after pulsing and another topic "smart packaging" before grape guard packaging in theory part of course PHT-522; topic "preservation by non-thermal processing like minimal processing" in theory and practical part of course PHT-511 and topic "Aseptic processing and packaging" in theory part of course PHT-531 are included. In the course PHT-532, topic "Estimation of phenolic compounds and pigments" is added in theory and practical while topic "Determination of relative water content (RWC), Importance of ethylene and plant pigments and their role in human nutrition" are deleted from theory part.

- 5. In the Department of Silviculture and Agroforestry, two courses namely SAF-523 and SAF-528 from list of major courses have been shifted to minor courses. Further, one course i.e. FPU-526 (Biotechnological Approaches and Agro techniques for MAP Species) is added as Minor Course.
- 6. In the Department of FBTI, under UG programme, family "Caesalpiniaceae" is added in Course FBT-111 (Dendrology) while family "Fabaceae" and "Mimosaceae" are shifted from minor to major description of theory part. The family "Graminae" renamed as "Poaceae" (New name of the Family) in theory part. In Practical part, family "Caesalpiniaceae" is added, seeing the local need. In PG programme, two course viz., FBT-522 and FBT-532 have been shifted from Major to Minor courses.
- 7. In the Department of Forest Products and Utilization, in course FPU-223 (Forest Tribology and Anthropology), content topic has been changed from "Tribes in India and Kerela" to "Tribes in India and Rajasthan". In course FPU-321 (Non Timber Forest Products), the course (theory and practical) has been replaced according to ICAR Vth Dean's Committee Report. In course FPU-322 (Marketing and Certification of Forest Produce), the course nomenclature has been changed to "Certification of Forest Products" and its theory and practical course outline has been suggested to be as per the ICAR V Dean's Committee report. The cr.hrs. of this course accordingly change from (2+1) to (2+0). The course code for Seminar has been changed to FPU-541 instead of FPU-591 and course code for comprehensive has also been changed to FPU-591 instead of FPU-541.
- 8. In the Department of Wildlife Management, the topic "Distribution of important Indian mammals" be changed to "General classification of Indian Mammals" in course WLS-121 (Wildlife Biology) while in WLS-221 (Ornithology & Herpetology) topic "General classification of Birds, Amphibians and Reptiles" are included. Further, the course WLS -524 (Ethology of Wild Animals) has been shifted from major to minor course with course code WLS-536.

9. In the Department of Plant Protection, in course PPR-212 (Fundamentals of Entomology), in Practical part, there is addition of topic "Identification of insect orders of agri-importance"; deletion of topic "Dissection of caterpillar" and "Dissection of cockroach", Replacement of topic "Observation on metamorphosis of larvae & pupae" with "metamorphosis of larvae & pupae" and "Study on morphology of grasshopper or cockroach" with "Study of internal anatomy and systems of grasshopper or cockroach". In Course PPR-221 (Insect Pests of Vegetable, Ornamental and spices Crops), in Practical part, there is addition of topic "Insecticides and their formulations"; "Pesticide appliances and their maintenance"; "Calculations on the doses of insecticides and application techniques"; "Safety measures in using pesticide formulations" and "Waiting periods of insecticides". In Course PPR-222 (Diseases of Fruit, Plantation, Medicinal and Aromatic Crops), and in Course PPR-312 (Diseases of Vegetable, Ornamental and Spice Crops), the topic "Exercise on Collection and Preservation of Diseased specimens" is added in practical part of both the courses.

10. In the Department of Natural Resource Management, NRM-113 (Fundamentals of Geology and Soils), addition of topic "Determination of soil moisture by using different methods" in practical art. NRM-121 (Soil Fertility and Nutrient Management), addition of topic "beneficial plant nutrient elements. Maximum yield concept". NRM-122 (Water Mgt in Horticultural Crops) addition of topic "Water budgeting" in practical part. NRM-212 (Forest Survey & Engineering) addition of topic "leveling by using dumpy level" in practical part. NRM-221 (Soil, Water and Plant Analysis) Estimation of available N, P and K in soil and plant. Determination of Ca and Mg in irrigation water in practical part. NRM-314 (Forest hydrology and watershed Management), Addition of topic "Climate smart rain water harvesting technology" in theory part. NRM 321 (Organic Farming) addition of topic "Preparation methodology of Indore, Banglore and NADEP, vermicompost, Neem extract for pest management, production technology of various indigenous organic inputs such Panchgabya, Jivamrut, Bijamrut, Neemastra, Brahmastra and Agneyastra for soil nutrition, seed treatment and plant protection, Comparative studies of biological products with respect to efficiency" in practical part.

11. In the courses of Department of Basic Science, in course BAS-111, the topic "Analysis of factorial experiments up to 3 factors, split plot design, strip plot design, long term experiments, plot size" are deleted. Topic "ISSR marker and PCR techniques and its application in crop improvement" is added in theory part of courses

BAS-212 and BAS -411.

Repudiation and Reduction of intake in some PG programme

The PG program in M.Sc. (Horticulture) PHT is running presently with an intake capacity of 2 seats. Since, there is no faculty in the Department; it is very difficult to run the PG programme. Similarly, the Department of Wildlife Management was started in 2018 with an intake capacity of 5 seats. Presently, there is only one faculty in the Department against sanctioned post of 3 (Assoc. Prof. -01, Assit. Prof. -02). Teaching along with guiding students with one faculty is difficult to justify. Looking at the existing faculty situation in the above mentioned Departments, it is proposed to defer PG program in PHT and reduce the no of intake capacity (seats) to 03 in Wildlife Management till the faculty position is filled up.

Resolved to approve the reduction of intake capacity from 05 to 02 scats in Department of Wildlife Management and 03 to 02 seats in Department of FLS and to discontinue the PG programme in PHT since academic session 2021-22 till the ICAR BSMA recommendations and availability of faculty.

Attachment in the Agri-based industries

Students shall be placed in agri-based industries for the period of 5 weeks. In this, students are attached with various industries like seed/sapling production, pesticide and insecticide industry, organic industry, post harvest and processing industry, nursery, FPOs, etc. The students will be undergone various activities as follows:

The All India Tour will be of two weeks. It includes up to maximum 10 days visit and rest of the days for preparation for the tour, report writing, etc. In this programme, the students will visit various regional and national level academic and research institutions/organizations related to horticulture, agriculture and allied fields in various regions of our country. They will gain firsthand knowledge about different agro climatic zones, crops grown, cultivation practices etc

Village Attachment Programme

The students will be placed for the period of total 12 weeks in which the students will work in the village under the direct supervision of KVK scientist for period of 7 weeks and the rest 5 weeks they will work at KVK and perform the task allotted to them by the KVK scientist and will organize different activities.

The various activities conducting during the period of Village attachment are:

KVK Attachment

The students shall be given an opportunity to acquaint themselves with the various activities / programmes of the concerned KVK. The principles and methodologies involved in conducting different types of experiments / trials, collection and analysis of experimental data, maintenance of farm records etc., shall be explained to them. The students will observe closely and perform different aspects of programmes / activities with the guidance of scientists of the respective centres. They shall maintain a record of the titles of programmes that was undertaken at the KVK. They must also record all the items of work either carried out by them or shown to them.

Selection of Village for Village Attachment Programme

A village will be a unit of operation of READY programme specially the village attachment programme. The village will be selected preferably nearby the centre of KVK within a radius of 5 to 30 km, where the transport is available and the KVK scientist can easily supervise the students. The potential villages should be selected for village attachment. The village which have different types of crop where the farmer used to practice various enterprises like crop production, horticulture, dairy, etc. should be selected

Monitoring the Work of Students

During the village placement period, scientist from KVK will monitor the activities of the students in the village.

Attendance and Disciplines:

The student should maintain minimum of 85 per cent attendance separately in all the RHWE programme courses. The students should maintain good discipline during the village attachment, KVK attachment, Agro-Industrial Attachment and Educational Tour. The students found indulged in any in disciplinary activities during whole programme will be dealt strictly as per university rules. Any student who want leave for official work of the university lie participation in sports, Youth Festival and other co-curricular activities should obtain the written permission of the Dean of the College.

Report and Work Diary

The student shall maintain work diary. On completion of each assignment, a detailed report should be written. The work diary shall be checked every day by the teacher/Scientist of KVK / trainer of agro-industry and report will be evaluated every week by the respective college teacher.

Evaluation of the Performance of the Students

The performance of the students in all components under READY programme will be evaluated separately by the committee. Rural Horticultural Work Experience Programmewill be of 20 credit hours. The bifurcations of marks allotment are as follows:
